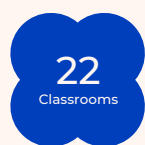

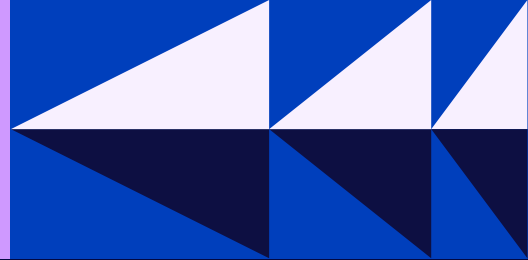
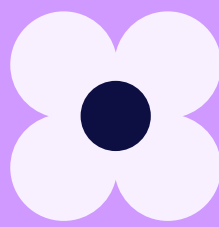
Closest Train Station: North York Centre
